## OVC SERVICES

### 24 Hour Crisis Line: 910-347-4000

Trained advocates provide telephone emotional support, crisis response, intake to the Emergency Shelter, and community resource information to survivors, co-survivors and the community.

### Emergency Shelter

This is a safe space in an undisclosed location for Survivors actively fleeing imminent danger or life-threatening conditions due to domestic violence, sexual assault, and/or human trafficking. These Survivors do not have other safe locations, resources, or support networks to gain other housing.

### Hospital Advocacy

Provides in-person emotional support, crisis response and community resource information to survivors of sexual or domestic violence in the local hospital Emergency Department.

### Court / Legal Advocacy

Assists clients by providing information about legal processes, assistance with completing and submitting Protective Order applications, accompaniment to court or law enforcement appointments, and referrals to Legal Aid.

### Case Management

Longer term advocacy available to Survivors in the community and the Emergency Shelter. Supports survivor in identifying needs, prioritizing, and by setting goals in their pathway to healing and independence.

### Support Groups

Available monthly for adult survivors of domestic and/or sexual assault. Please check our website for dates and registration.

## Domestic Violence

**Domestic Violence** is a pattern of abusive behavior that one person uses to control or dominate another person in a relationship. It can involve physical, sexual, emotional, economic, psychological, or technological acts or threats. It can happen in any household, family, or intimate partner relationship.

## Sexual Assault

**Sexual Assault** is any sexual activity you do not consent to. It includes rape or attempted rape, any unwanted sexual contact, or threats. Sexual assault can happen with anyone, even someone you have a sexual or romantic relationship with. Consent means that you agree to the sexual activity freely and willingly, and you can withdraw it at any time.

## What is an advocate?

Specially trained with broad focus on all elements of victimization to provide trauma responsive services and empower survivors in their healing journey. Advocates collaborate with the survivor to identify and prioritize needs, set goals, provide options, resources, and referrals. Interactions with a trained advocate are confidential and privileged in North Carolina.

- Crisis intervention
- Exploration of coping strategies
- Identify and respond to cognitive distortions
- Psychoeducation on the dynamics of SA/DV/HT
- Linkage to community resource
